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Introduction

HUMAN WELFARE Foundation (HWF) — a trust formed to carry out charitable activities on different fronts to help, guide, assist and serve the needy of the country — aims to bring the deprived sections of the society into the mainstream.

The HWF is mainly working in the field of education. However, the organization is also involved in various other charitable activities. With a goal to serve the humanity, the annual plan for the year 2011-12 was chalked out. The Human Welfare Foundation team did its best to achieve the set target.

This annual report carries the details of HWF plans, activities, achievements, funds and expenses during the year 2011-12. This report, like earlier ones, is just a small showcase of the intention and efforts of the foundation.

Education remained the prime focus in FY 2011-2012

Education not only makes a human being a better person but it also helps in the growth of a society and the nation. The Human Welfare foundation is trying its best to educate as many as people – particularly the poor and the needy.

During the year 2011-2012, the HWF carried out several educational projects — from assisting in setting up of primary schools to upgrading the existing schools; from setting up of vocational technical schools to distributing scholarships to post graduate and undergraduate students.

School bags distributed among poor students

HUMAN Welfare Foundation distributed schoolbags to around 3,000 needy students during the year 2011-2012.

The initiative was aimed at supporting the children whose parents are financially weak and are unable to bear additional expenses beside school fees.

The project has encouraged a larger number of poor and destitute children to go to school. These students had earlier discontinued their education due to financial problems.

Under the school bag scheme, the HWF also gives financial support to students to help them buy their dress, course books, and stationary items or can give their school fees.

HWF also arrange syllabus books and give to children in bag to encourage them for getting education and ease their financial burden.



Human Welfare Foundation believes that social backwardness can eradicate by education.

HWF has been distributing school bag to different states of India since the last 4 years.

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Needy students were given UG/PG scholarships



Scholarships come as a blessing for students, whose parents cannot afford to educate their children. The HWF is doing its best to help the poor so that no one lags behind in the society due to lack of education. Everyone has the right to be educated and it should not be denied.

Mass Marriage:

The HWF spent Rs 2, 20, 000 to organize mass marriages program for poor and needy people of the society during the year 2011-12. It is shocking that many financially suppressed people are unable to marry their daughters well in time because of heavy demand of dowry as a result of which thousands marriageable girls are confronting with this social problem. We provide an opportunity to wealthy people and philanthropists to share the burden of poor segment of society to ensure timely marriages of their daughters.



Prof. K A Siddique Hassan, General Secretary, HWF presided over the public meeting held at the marriage function. He said that Human Welfare Foundation is committed to work for the construction of a healthy society. Since family is the most important and basic institution in all society, vision 2016 has included it too in its multi dimensional activities. Humanity is our basic concern and so the married couples in the mass marriage function includes brides and bride grooms from different religious sects.

Sabitri Mitra, West Bengal Minister for women and child development and social welfare, local MLA Raheem Baksi, Block development officers of three adjacent blocks, sub-divisional development officer and several religious leaders took part in the function.

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Safe Drinking Water:

The foundation installed 10 public wells and hand pumps in the area where people were facing severe water problems. Hand pumps and well project provides safe drinking water to women and children; giving them more time, freedom and incentive to help their families grow to be healthy and productive members of their community.



Housing scheme:

The HWF assisted 9 homeless families by providing them either permanent solutions or temporary shelters. We identified many old ages and destitute persons who don't have access to home, we support them under Housing scheme.

Career guidance:

The foundation assisted hundreds of students by providing them guidance on which career would suit them best given their talents, skills and resources. Foundation offers carrier guidance services to students and disseminate information on educational opportunities and giving career guidance and coaching to students along with moral values.

Orphan Scholarship:

The foundation assisted many orphans and provided scholarship for their education and care. During the financial year foundation provided 82,750 rupee for orphan as scholarship.



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HWF awards 1,643 meritorious students in FY 2011-12

Delhi-based Human Welfare Foundation awarded 1,643 meritorious students of Uttar Pradesh, Delhi, Bihar and West Bengal in the year 2011-12. In Bihar, the foundation joined hands with P. M. Foundation, Kerala, to hold a ceremony to award students for academic excellence in Patna.

A total of 449 meritorious students and 3 state toppers of board exams were honoured at the ceremony on December 19, 2011 at Sri Krishna Memorial Hall, North Gandhi Maidan, Patna.

The state toppers - Anupam Neha, Khushboo Kumari and Rahul Kumar-were awarded with certificates, mementos and cash prizes along with others who passed the 2010 Board Exams with more than 65 per cent marks. The 449 best meritorious students were selected among one thousand applicants who scored with first division marks in the Bihar board examinations held in 2010.

On this occasion, chief guest of the program, Justice of Patna High Court, Hon'ble Justice Nayyer Hassan appreciated the efforts of HWF and P. M. Foundation for organizing such program in Bihar to encourage meritorious students

65th Independence Day marked at The Scholar School

India's 65th Independence Day celebrations held at The Scholar School. Children delivered speeches on several interesting and important topics and emphasized the struggle and sacrifices given by the leaders like Maulana Abul Kalam Azad, Maulana Mohd. 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HWF adopts Milak Pallapura under model village initiative

One of the key activities of The Human Welfare Foundation is to make people aware about how a village should be and discuss with local people how their place can become a model village.

It organizes empowerment and orientation camps for people of a locality to inform them about several topics including the role of Panchayat, Right To Education, basic concept of development in villages, elements of a model village were presented. In the year 2011-12, the HWF adopted Milak Pallapura, which is one of the two settlements in Pallapura Ghosi Village near Pakbara in Moradabad Development Block of Moradabad district in Uttar Pradesh.

The team found that most of the villagers are being uneducated and want to get education and employment and some need financial help for starting their own businesses. The houses of villagers are also in pathetic condition which needs repair and construction and many of the houses have no hand pump facility. A vast majority of population of village seemed to be completely unaware of any government schemes in the village, not even National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (NREGA).

HWF chalked out a three-year plan to achieve its target to make it as a model village free from all types of backwardness. The plan includes homes for poor, a vocational training centre for girls and implementation of all government development schemes for the village. The women wants to learn sewing and embroidery work but the training centre is located at far distances which is unaffordable and due to their security concern they are not reaching to these centre.

The HWF also met government officials for implementing the welfare schemes for this village. However, the government alone cannot provide all the facilities to this village.

Therefore, the HWF vowed to focus on the areas which are not in government schemes. In the starting phase, Human Welfare Foundation worked on the following points :-

Provide hand pump for safe and pure drinking water, to enroll the children of every eligible children of each houses in good schools, ration card, artisan cards registration, to construct houses for deserving people, make toilet in houses and provide better health facility by starting health clinics and mobile medical van etc.
