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Annual Report (2012-2013)



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Introduction

Human Welfare Foundation (HWF) is a trust formed to carry out charitable activities on different fronts to help, guide, assist and serve the needy of the country and bring them into the mainstream.

The HWF is mainly working in the field of education. However, the organization is also involved in various other charitable activities.

This annual report carries the details of HWF plans, activities, achievements, funds and expenses during the year 2012-13. This report, like earlier ones, is just a small showcase of the intention and efforts of the foundation. Our executives and volunteers are working very hard to make this country a better place where every equality, justice and prosperity prevails. We are grateful to the generous contributors with whose financial help we are able to carry out the social upliftment work. Without them, this would not have been possible. The HWF is optimistic that it will expand its social welfare activities as more funds start pouring in.

Helping have-nots fulfill their basic needs and join the mainstream is the best thing one can do for the fellow human beings. The HWF takes this opportunity to thank everyone for their support – be it physical, financial or emotional – in its initiative to help the poor and needy of the society.



Educational Projects

Education is crucial for the growth of any society. The Human Welfare foundation tried its best to contribute its two cent in spreading the learning among the poor and needy of the country during the year 2012-2013.

It carried out several educational projects — from assisting in setting up of primary schools to upgrading the existing schools; from setting up of vocational technical schools to distributing scholarships to post graduate and undergraduate students.

HWF runs various scholarship programs for poor students

Scholarships come as a blessing for students, whose parents cannot afford to educate their children. The HWF is doing its best to help the poor so that no one lags behind in the society due to lack of education. Everyone has a right to be educated.

SCHOOL PROJECTS AT A GLANCE

- Funding primary schools: The foundation funded four schools.
- Upgrading the existing schools The HWF helped in upgrading two schools during the year. It also supported nine other schools whom it was assisting a year earlier.

scholarships for orphans

- o 174 scholarships A total of 174 scholarships were given to orphan students.
- o Rs 1,000 per child An amount of Rs 1,000 per month per child was given to the concerned child during 2012-2013

First installment of the scholarship was distributed among 484 students (both boys and girls included) during the year 2012-2013. The number was increased from 161 a year earlier.

The foundation also disbursed scholarship to 65 students from a year earlier batch as the second installment.

School bags distributed among needy students

The Human Welfare Foundation distributed schoolbags to 4,800 students during the year 2012-2013.

The foundation earlier planned to distribute only 2,200 schoolbags among needy students. The HWF School Bag Project was aimed at addressing the huge number of dropout rates in 11 states of north India.

The project has encouraged a larger number of poor and destitute children to go to school. These students had earlier discontinued their education due to financial problems. Under the school bag scheme, HWF gives financial support students to help them buy their

dress, course books, and stationary items or can give their school fees.

HWF also arrange syllabus books and give to children in bag to encourage them for getting education and lower their financial problems.

HWF believes that the social backwardness can only be eliminated primarily by bringing the young to school. HWF has been distributing school bag to different states of India since the last 5 years.

A total of 4,800 students benefited from the project implemented in Delhi and few other northern states of the country.



Awards for Academic Excellence 2013 given to students

Human Welfare Foundation's prestigious Awards for Academic Excellence 2013 functions were organized in Delhi and few other northern Indian states.

Those students who scored more than 80 per cent in their 10th standard board exams were eligible to apply for awards. They were then selected and awarded in a function. The students selected for awards appeared for aptitude tests organized by Human Welfare Foundation and were guided for their higher education. The parents of these students were also counseled regarding the student's career.

The dignitaries of the highest eminence of that locality attended all the Programs.

The Programs were well attended and were very much appreciated by the parents and dignitaries, along with the fully crowded audiences in all these Programs. One of the aims to organize the event in various states was to motivate local people to either organize such functions on their own or at least help and share the physical and financial burden of organizing them.

Nearly 7,000 students appeared for Talent Search Exam

A total of 6,914 students participated in the Talent Search Examination conducted by Human Welfare Foundation in the year 2012-2013.

The exam was aimed at short listing the talented students of class 8th level and gradually help, encourage and equip them for various competitive examinations especially National Talent Search Examination.

This exam was conducted at raising awareness among students about National Talent Search Examination organized by the government every year.

One lakh economically poor students are selected annually through NMMSE for scholarships by the government. HWF assists the students to prepare for this exam by holding a mock NMTSE at state level.



Schools run by HWF given assistance to expand learning

Model village: (Activities & Achievements)

One of the key activities of The Human Welfare Foundation is to make people aware about how a village should be and discuss with local people how their place can become a model village.

It organizes empowerment and orientation camps for people of a locality to inform them about several topics including the role of Panchayat, Right To Education, basic concept of development in villages, elements of a model village were presented.

One such camp was organized for villagers of Milak Pallupura during the year 2012-2013.

Assignments were given to the selected village volunteers for the development program of the village.

The camp was organized basically to empower the villagers so that they become aware of the various government schemes for the development of the village. A detailed evaluation was done as to know the needs to convert Milak Pallupura to a model village.

A documentary was screened on how a model village should be. Importance & necessities of school managing committee has been discussed.

First HWF chapter formally launched in Andhra Pradesh

The first state chapter of HWF was launched in Andhra Pradesh by a formal inaugural function at Madina Education Centre Auditorium, Nampally, Hyderabad.

The programme was attended by personalities of highest eminence in Hyderabad. Dr Abdul Majeed Khan, senior psychiatrist and president of the AP Chapter of Human Welfare Foundation said in his inaugural address that it is the duty of a nation to plan and strive for country's development and HWF will motivate the people by action in this direction.

Professor Mohammed Sulaiman Siddiqui, Exvice Chancellor, Osmania University and member of the Foundation expressed that a nation which does not know the art of changing as per the demands of the day is lagged behind and looses the chances to progress. Mr. Abdul Jabbar Siddiqui, General Secretary of Human Welfare Foundation of AP Chapter

stated that nation building is not a temporary or short term work but it requires continuous efforts of one or two generation. "It required solid human efforts, human and material resources, self-less efforts and courageous leadership," he said.

The AP Chapter intends to open student educational institutions vocational training schools, multi-specialty hospitals, which charge nominal fees, interest free cooperative societies, etc.

Mr. Akbar Ali Khan, Vice Chancellor (Telangana University), Mr. Zaheer Ali Khan (Managing Editor, Urdu Daily Siasat), Maulana Mufti Sadiq Mohiuddin Faheem (Jamia Nizamia), Mr. Syed Azmathullah I.A.S and Justice E. Ismail who are also the members of the foundation spoke on the occasion.

Human Welfare Foundation wins key National Award

- Career Workshop The foundation assisted hundreds of students by providing them guidance on which career would suit them best given their talents, skills and resources.
- Slum Development Project: HWF conducted many activities in slums of lucknow as drinking water facilities, sanitation awareness etc.
