## From the Desk of General Secretary



The year, 2020-21 was very tough and challenging for all of us. The global outbreak of unprecedented Covid-19 pandemic and its huge impact on all spheres of the life tested our human capacity and progress. In India, the pandemic was more devastating as millions of people had to fight for survival. In this catastrophic situation, Society for Bright Future- SBF acted as a ray of hope for thousands of needy and deprived people across the country.

Major focus of the organization during 2020-21 was, obviously, to help the pandemic hit people from marginalized segments of the society. When the whole country was locked down, our volunteers were in the frontline along with other Govt. and private agencies distributing cooked food packets for migrants, supplying ration kits for needy families, providing safety measures for Covid warriors, creating awareness in rural areas, conducting assessment surveys, and volunteering for Govt. bodies in fighting the pandemic.

Our response to Amphan Cyclone was quick. It was the biggest cyclone to hit in two decades killing at least 98 people and ravaging several parts of West Bengal and Odisha. More than 650 SBF volunteers were actively engaged in relief activities in six severely hit districts.

'Har Qadam Swatchhta Ki Or' (Every Steps Towards Cleanliness) is a promising initiative we started this year. This nation-wide yearlong cleanliness drive with an aim of making a meaningful contribution towards a Cleaner and Greener India was launched on 14 March 2021 at India Islamic Culture Centre, New Delhi. Through this project, SBF intends to team up with the local government bodies, corporates, local community leaders and grassroot volunteers to execute a sustained sanitation drive at 100 different locations across the country.

Despite the challenges, our dedicated team was enthusiastically dynamic in achieving the annual targets and responding to emergency situations. I am delighted to have this team. I express heartfelt gratitude to our donors and partners without whom our initiatives would be futile. With your generous support and kind gestures, we could touch thousands of lives with hope when they were in a state of despair.

The Emergency and Relief Programme of SBF includes providing survival kits comprising food, water, clothes, shelter and medical care during emergencies. It also conducts capacity building workshops and training to cope up with disasters. The rehabilitation programme also includes assistance for differently-abled, reconstruction of residential and commercial properties of the affected population and provides livelihood assistance. The SBF banks upon its large pool of trained, skilled and dedicated volunteers across the country.

Preparing volunteers over a period of time through capacity building is the key towards making them resilient.



### 2 Days State - Training Workshop on Disaster Management, Kakrala, Badaun, UP West | 13th - 14th January 2021

The workshop was well attended by 50 participants. The workshop included sessions, lectures and on-hand training by various experts from the field of Disaster Management.





## 2 Days State - Training Workshop on Disaster Management, Marora, Mewat, Haryana | 13th - 14th February 2021

45 volunteers participated in the workshop. The workshop included sessions, lectures and on-hand training by various experts from the field of Disaster Management.



## 2 Days State - Training Workshop on Disaster Management, Gorakhpur, UP East 30th - 31st January 2021

The workshop included sessions and lectures on disaster management, qualities and responsibilities of volunteers and on-hand training in fire fighting skills and team building.



## 5 Days National Advance training workshop for Disaster Management and Advance Techniques in Dhauj, Haryana 22nd - 26th March 2021

Society for Bright Future organised a training workshop on advanced techniques in disaster management for its volunteers, in Dhauj, Haryana. Forty volunteers from 14 states attended the workshop. The 5-day workshop helped volunteers to learn different techniques and skills in disaster preparedness, training on physical fitness, first aid, raft making, rescue during flood, spider-web team building activities and leadership skills. Special training was provided on conducting final rites of the dead.





# RELIEF & REHABILITATION



## COVID 19 LOCKDOWN RELIEF WORK

The COVID-19 lockdown has changed the life of every individual in the country. Millions of daily-wage earners have lost their jobs and are struggling to fend for themselves and their families.

### Awareness Activities under the Assam State Sponsor Program

The Protirodhi Bandhu (Resistant Friends) initiative is a community engagement programme, in which 50 SBF volunteers were enrolled in every revenue circle in 04 districts of Assam-North, for creating awareness among the community about Covid-appropriate behaviour.



### Survey

SBF volunteers monitored and protected over 15,000 families, covering a population of over 75 thousand including more than 15,000 children in rural areas. Survey programs were organized under the "Disease Containment Campaign" and "Knock Door Campaign" to identify Covid-19 cases and symptomatic patients. Surveys organized in 02 districts of U.P West, 04 districts of Assam and 02 districts in Bihar, during 29 March and 5th April 2020.



### Civilian Protection for Covid-19

Volunteers were deputed to monitor the containment zones in Covid-19 hotspots and provide assistance to poor families, who couldn't afford to properly conduct the final rites of the deceased. One hundred ninety volunteers were engaged by District Administration at Assam, Bihar and Western U.P, and 203 hotspots were managed by the SBF volunteers.

### Relief Work for Stranded

522 migrant labourers of Assam, Bihar, West Bengal and Jharkhand who were stranded in 11 states were identified, contacted and provided ration and logistic support.

## Cooked Meals

1,58,483 cooked meals were provided to daily wage earners in Delhi, Gujarat, Jharkhand, MP, Punjab, U.P West, Uttarakhand and West Bengal every day through community kitchens run by SBF.



## Mask Distribution

2,600 masks have been distributed among rural communities in 03 States



## Amphan Relief Activities, West Bengal

Amphan's landfall coincided with the high tide on the afternoon of May 20, 2020, resulting in breaching of the embankment and widespread flooding in WB. The water breached the bunds and flooded the lands, causing massive damage to property and agriculture.

## Dry Ration Distribution

Dry ration kits were provided to 23,269 most vulnerable and underprivileged families in 17 states. 10000 families were linked with government schemes for ration supply.

## FLASH FLOOD TRAGEDY UTTARAKHAND



Glacial burst on Feb 7 resulted in a massive disaster near the hydroelectric plant sites, under construction.

**COUNSELING:** SBF team consisting of 5 volunteers worked during 9th-12th Feb 2021, and conducted last rites of those dead in the disaster and organized counselling of 25 individual of the relatives and spouses of the affected families.

## DELHI RELIEF & REHABILITATION

On the eve of February 23, riots broke out in Northeast Delhi between Anti-Citizenship Amendment Act (CAA) and pro-CAA protestors. The violence took a communal turn and led to the death of over 53 people over the course of next 10 days. More than 200 were left injured. Homes were burned and belongings and assets looted, mosques and shops set ablaze. Incidents of violence against women and girls and elderly were also reported. Maujpur, Chand Bagh, Kardampuri, Bhajanpura, Gokalpuri, Khajuri Khas, Yamuna Vihar and Brijpuri neighbourhood were engulfed in the conflagration. The violence subsided in few days, but the consequences of violence were very disheartening.

### IMMEDIATE RESPONSE BY SBF

Right after the incidents, government agencies and various social organizations came forward to support the affected families. SBF, along with other partner organizations under Vision 2026 like Human Welfare Foundation (HWF), Human Welfare Trust (HWT), and Medical Service Society (MSS) also immediately responded to the situation by facilitating to set up a relief camp, distributing thousands of ration kits, and organizing medical camps. Under this immediate response, 7000+ food kits were distributed, 2100+ medical camps were organized, 1500+ people were given essential items in relief camps, 160+ victims were provided with legal aids, and 800+ dignity kits and clothing items were distributed. After immediate response, SBF came up with a proper rehabilitation project intended at rebuilding lives and livelihoods that were destroyed by the rioters. The project was methodically designed after face-to-face surveys with the affected families. 250 families have been supported through the rehabilitation project. The project includes 179 livelihood projects and renovation/repair/ reconstruction of 70 burnt houses. Under the livelihood projects, commercial shops, commercial vehicles, autorickshaws, bikes, cycles, e-rickshaws, sewing machines, vegetable carts, kiosk, and stocks for shops were given to affected families as means of livelihood.

**MOHD YOUNUS KHAN (Age : 45)**

A resident of Old Garhi Mendu was running his Phenyl manufacturing unit at his residence's ground floor with 4 employees. When the riots broke out, the unit was looted, and liquid chemicals were flushed on street. Khan had a loss of approx 5 lakhs. Vision extended its support to Khan by renovating his house and providing him with raw materials for detergent manufacturing unit.

**SALMAN**

Salman from Mustafabad found his daily bread from a small restaurant that he owned after years of persistence and dedication. Rioters looted all his belongings while driving home loading them after building owner asked to vacate the shop for renovation. The next day on 24 February he was shot in leg and seriously injured while returning from morning prayer. Though underwent treatment and recovered he could not remove the bullet yet. Vision helped him stand on his own feet again by opening his own restaurant.

**KHURSHEED SAIFI**

Khursheed Saifi, an interior furniture worker, was residing in Old Mustafabaad in his own house with parents and brothers. During riots, while saving others, he was severely beaten on the right eye which later led to complete blindness of the same. Unable to continue with his profession, Saifi was left in a complete darkness. Vision lighted his life again by providing with full of stocks for his grocery shop.

**KHALEEL**

Khaleel, 48, was residing at his own house in Shiv Vihar with his wife and four children. He met living through a horse buggy he used for transportation of goods. His son Irfan, 19, was also helping him in this work. During the riots, Khaleel's house was looted and the horse buggy parked outside the home was set afire. Horse ran away from the fire and disappeared. To the wonder of even Khaleel, after days, horse came back to him. Adding to his joy, Vision helped him for purchasing a new buggy for the horse.

**DR. DHARAMPAL**

Dr Dharampal, 40, was living with his family in Trilok Puri. He is General Physician by profession and running his clinic in Shiv Vihar from last fifteen years. At the time riot, his clinic was burned down by the rioters. Fallen into deep financial crisis, Dharampal was left alone and helpless. Vision reinvented his life by rebuilding the entire clinic and financing for medicines and equipment. Also, his son Suryansh, a 9th class student was given scholarship.

**USMAN FAREEDI**

Usman Fareedi brother of Arshi Fareedi 18, is a brilliant girl who had cleared her 12th with 94% marks. She is planning to take admission for undergraduate course in a reputed university and build a bright career. Her house was raided by the rioters and her brother Usman computer shop was robbed. Usman's father, Suleiman (46) worked as a painter and is suffering from deep spinal problem which made his unable to work anymore. Arshi's mother is a housewife and only brother (Usman) is studying in 9th class. Vision gave her (Arshi's) wings back by sponsoring her entire higher education under its Meritorious Girls Scholarship' scheme. Also, a new car given to her brother Usman for living.

**SHARIF HUSSAIN**

Sharif Hussain (34), a resident of Khajuri Khas and father of two children, was running a garment unit in the same town. 28 employees worked there. During the riots, the unit was looted and set afire. A stock of 2000 stitched pieces, raw materials, and machines all worth 25 lakhs were burnt down. Sharif worked day and night to establish his own business. Losing all his earnings, he was left in complete darkness. Vision lighted his life again by providing him with machineries and raw materials for his garment unit.

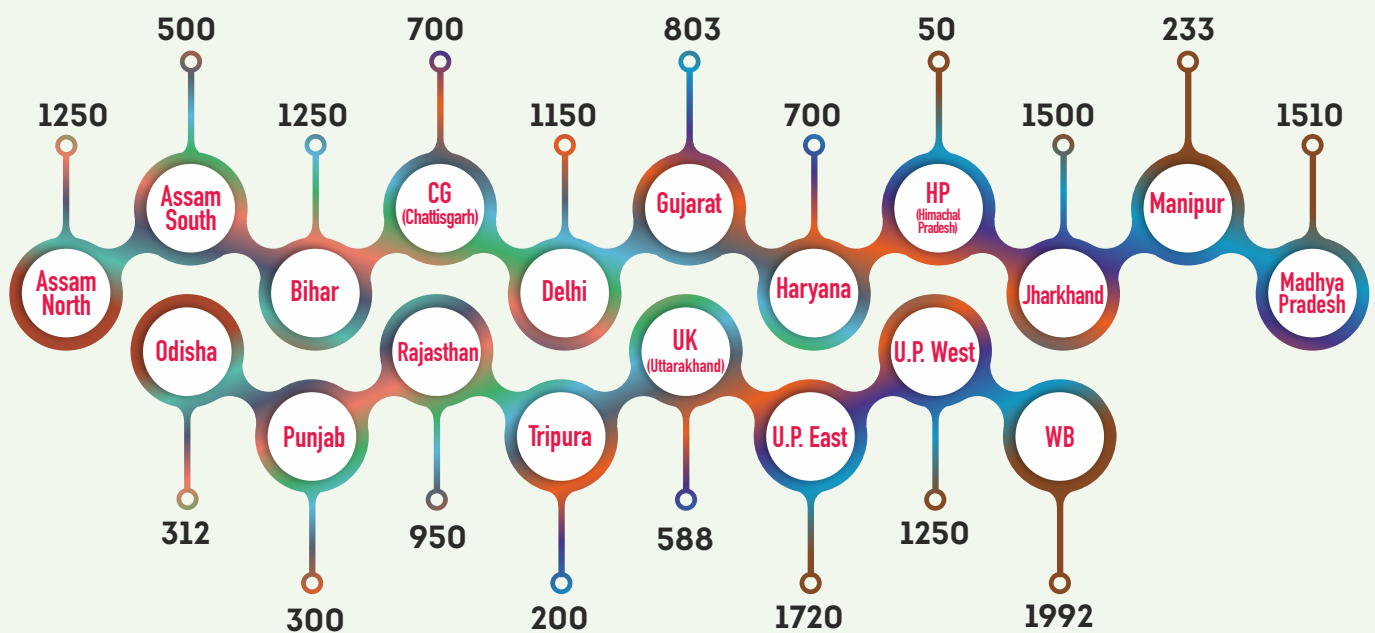




## WINTER RELIEF

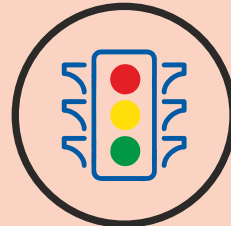

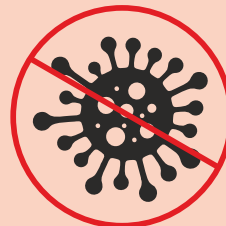

SBF is going to launch a nationwide one-year long campaign towards the goal of clean India. In this connection a meeting of Okhla-based NGOs were held on 08 December 2020 at it's headquarters, in which following NGOs participated - Baliga Trust, Cequin, Adhikar Foundation, Save the Children, Samaj Sudhar Trust, Volunteer of Change and CII Foundation. The meeting was presided over by Mr. Irfan Ahmad, National Coordinator, SBF. He appreciated all the efforts made by the NGOs to keep Okhla and the Delhi clean. NGOs agreed to collaborate with SBF in this endeavour. The meeting was convened by Amir Jamal, Volunteer Coordinator and organized by Irshad Ahmad Convener, Delhi volunteer Core.



## 2<sup>nd</sup> Okhla NGOs meet

The Second Okhla NGOs Meet was held at the office of All India Muslim Majlis-e-Mushawarat-e-Delhi, Abul Fazl Enclave on 5th January 2021 under the patronage of the Society for Bright Future in association with Volunteers of Change. The deep concern of the joint meeting was Okhla constituency of Delhi, and its sanitation, and the need to work together for the development of Okhla. Under Har Qadam Swachhta Ki Or campaign on 13th March, Society for Bright Future took the initiative to have a cleaner environment and started the campaign from Okhla. 50 volunteers participated in a cleanliness drive near Al-Shifa Hospital and cleared the dump yard.







Under the research and development division of Society for Bright Future, observational surveys were carried out in the village of Bandia, Town Mangaldoi, District Darrang, Assam during 18th to 23rd January 2021, to understand and chalk out a plan to control soil erosion in the villages affected by flood. SBF submitted a project proposal to ASDMA for sustainable development of the areas affected, and check soil erosion through conservation activities.

### Flood Awareness



A flood awareness programme was organized at Nabajyoti Jatiya Vidyalaya and 200 leaflets of DDMA were circulated among teachers and students living in flood-prone areas. They face floods every year from mid-June to mid-September. This activity aims to create awareness and measures to be taken in the future.

## ORGANIZATIONAL ACTIVITIES

Frequent meetings of volunteers are pertinent to attain the set objectives of the organization. These meetings ensure capacity building of the volunteer force and their preparedness during disasters. During natural disasters, we always observe that a large number of volunteers willingly participate in the operations, motivated by a sense of social service. We also analyse their preparedness in emergency situations during disasters. Analysis of Public Utility Programs in core areas is also carried out. One of the challenges as well as achievement is augmentation of volunteers to increase the reach of the organization across the country.

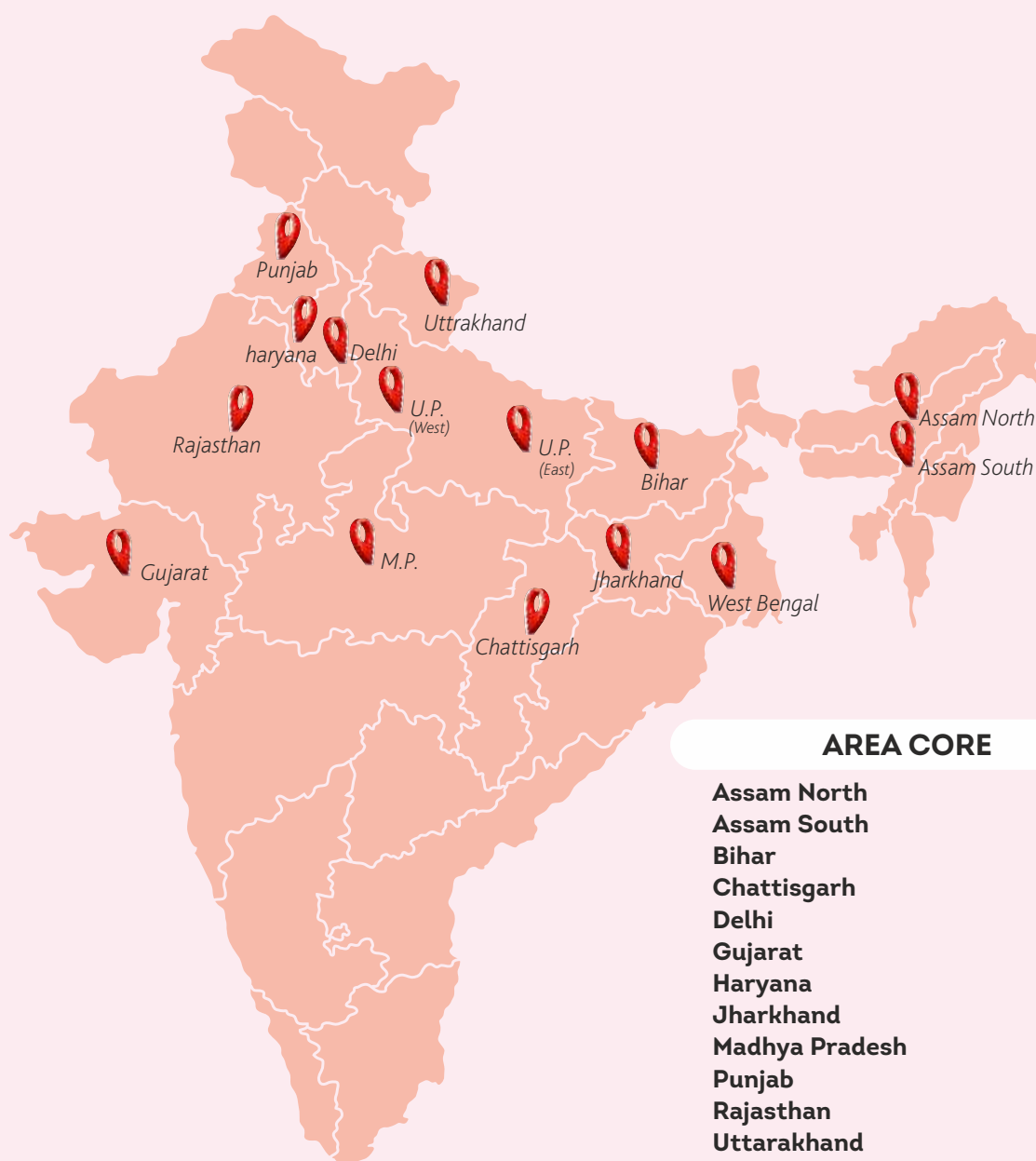

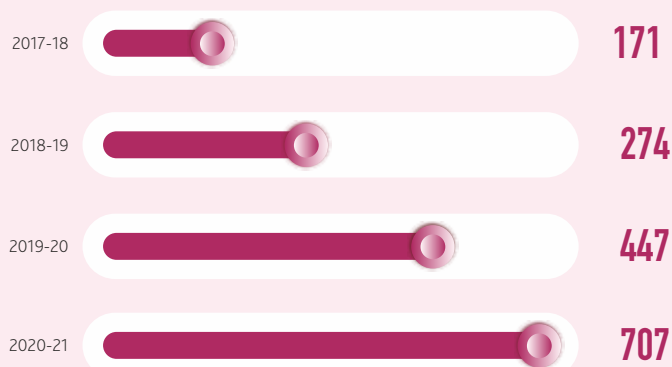
