In this issue, we bring to you the inspiring work done by the Society for Bright Future, a non-government organization that has been serving humanity for over a decade. As we know that India is one of the most disaster-prone countries in the world. The geographical features render it vulnerable to a number of natural hazards such as cyclone, drought, floods, earthquakes, fire, landslides and avalanches.

Though, India has integrated administrative machinery for disaster management at National, State and District levels, however there is always a necessity of non-government organizations as a supplementary to the State relief efforts by initiating supportive actions.

For a long-term planning and preparedness for disaster mitigation the role of a non-government organizations like Society for Bright future (SBF), becomes very important. The SBF since its formation in a decade ago has set a benchmark in tackling aforesaid disastrous situations and help the vulnerable population. In past few years, the SBF has respond over dozens of disasters including Assam Flood, Eastern Uttar Pradesh Flood, Kerala Flood, Jamnagar Flood, Konkan Maharashtra Flood and rescued more than 90000 people.

Last year alone, the SBF organised 28 Earthquake Awareness program in 5 different states among school and College students. The Society for bright Future, which aims to provide road safety information for road users to encourage safer road user behaviour among current and prospective road users and reduce the number of people killed and injured on our roads every year, also organised 8 Traffic Awareness Programs in 3 Different states of India.

Under project Rahat (Blanket Distribution Program in winter season) last year, the SBF have successfully organized 227 programs in 14 states in which 17392 blankets were distributed to the needy families.

From day one of our work, we have worked during flood and other calamities and our dedicated volunteers has covered 6 states of India where flood has affected a lot. Our volunteers have also responded several fire incidents in 3 states of India. Our volunteers have played key role in rescue and relief during train incidents, landslide and cyclone, which has been occurred in different states of India. There are hundreds of dedicated volunteers who has responded for a noble cause.

To train its volunteers the SBF organized over a dozen workshops in several parts of India to prepare the volunteers to respond during any calamity viz manmade or natural in their areas and across the country. We are proud to mention that our efforts are powered by a team of over 414 dedicated volunteers, who have been instrumental in responding to these catastrophic events and making a positive impact in the lives of those affected.

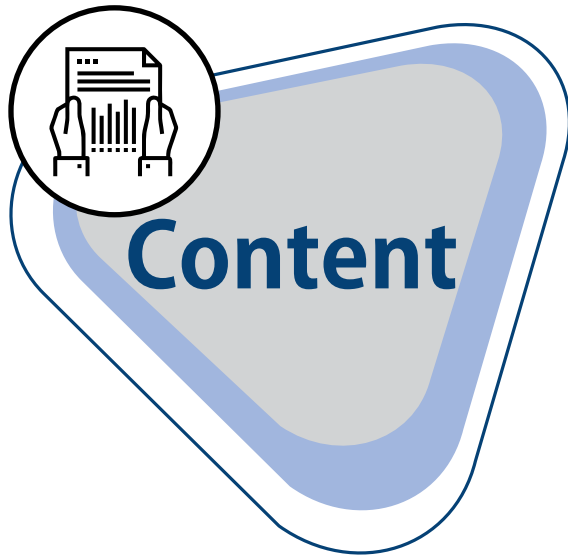

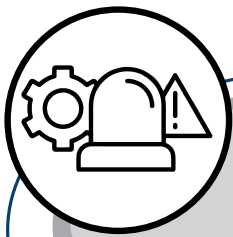
The need to prepare for a world of unexpected shocks has become clearer than ever, as epidemics, floods, storms, droughts and wildfires are expected to become more frequent and severe, affecting hundreds of millions of people every year. Disaster preparedness requires proactive action and investment in preparedness, rather than waiting for the next disaster to hit.

Established in 2006, SBF is a non-profit NGO specializing in emergency relief and rehabilitation. In the past, SBF has quickly responded to natural calamities in Bihar, Assam, Andhra Pradesh, Delhi, and Uttar Pradesh by providing First Aid supplies, shelter, blankets, water, food, and other basic survival materials. It has trained 3,000+ volunteers at district, state and national levels.



Vision and Mission

- The aim of is to equip all attendees with the necessary skills, knowledge, and resources to effectively respond and manage disasters in their communities.
- It also aims to build the competencies of disaster relief workers and volunteers in improving the preparedness and response time at all levels before and after disasters.

- With our training programs, one can develop the knowledge and skills necessary to effectively respond to disasters and create a safer and more resilient community.

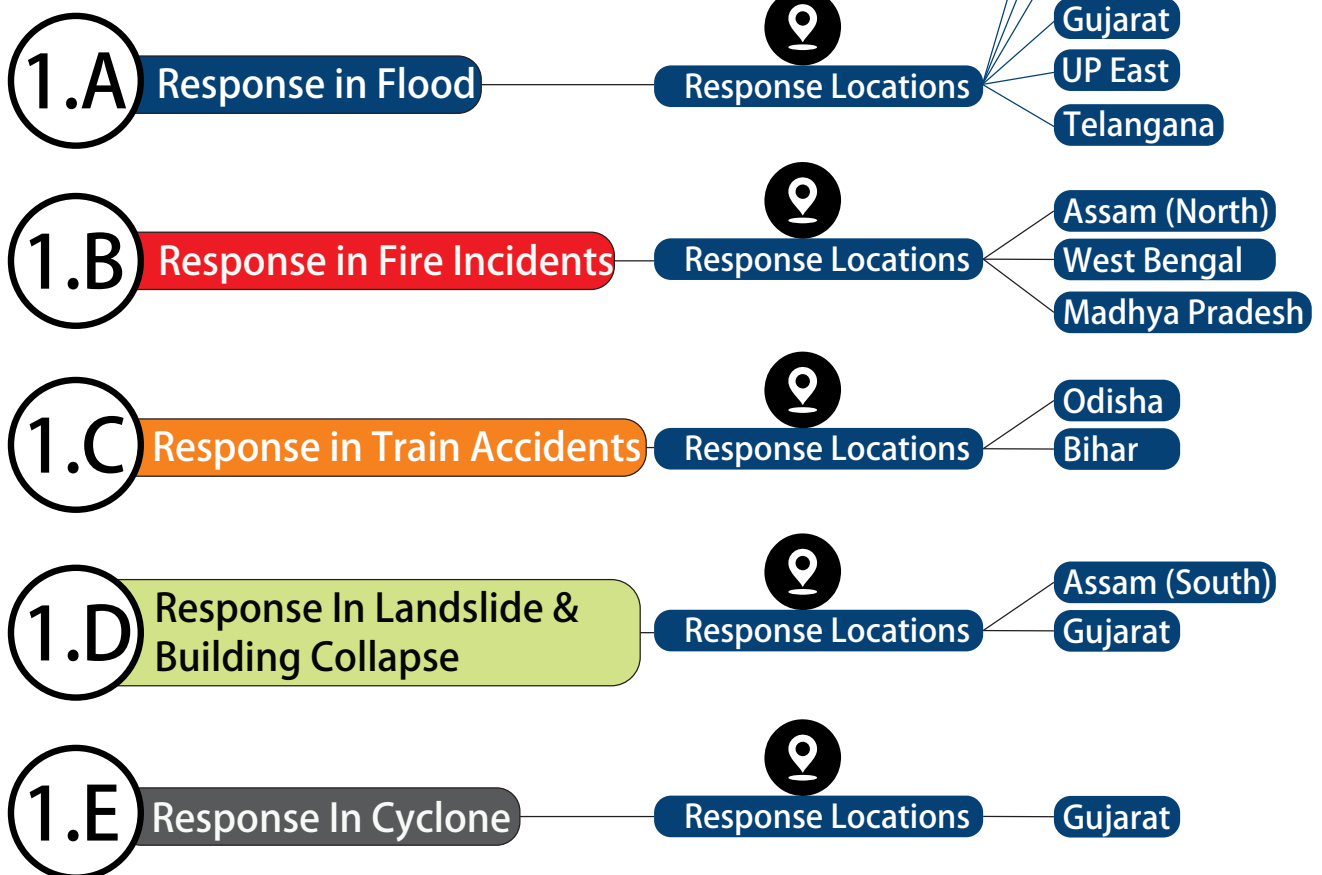

1.A.1 Response in Delhi Flood

In July 2023, Delhi faced an unprecedented flood crisis as heavy rainfall inundated numerous low-lying areas. Our headquarters team responded swiftly by conducting extensive water level assessments in affected neighborhoods, including regions along the Yamuna River. Recognizing the urgent need for relief, we distributed essential supplies, including clean drinking water, food packets, and vital medicines, to mitigate the hardships faced by flood-affected residents. To ensure efficient aid distribution and assistance, we established a dedicated help desk in a central location within the affected areas. Our team also met with South Delhi SDM, Mr. Sanjay Jha, to discuss government arrangements in response to the flood.

1.A.2 Response in Punjab Flood

In response to a flood alert covering 250 villages across 08 districts in Punjab, the Rapid Action Core (RAC) of SBF Punjab acted swiftly to ensure the safety of affected communities. RAC efficiently mobilized its resources and conducted a thorough assessment of flood-prone areas like Malerkotla, Sangrur, Patiala, and Amluh. Their immediate priority was to identify urgent needs and, subsequently, our team provided essential relief in the form of drinking water, biscuits, and essential medicines. Additionally, we organized a medical relief camp in five villages of Jalandhar on August 6, 2023, serving both humans and animals. Over 200 individuals received treatment for various health issues.

1.A.3 Response in Assam Flood (Assam North)



SBF responded to several floods in Assam that affected numerous districts, including Dhubri, Madarpur, Chirang, and Nalbari. These floods were caused by various factors, such as the rising water levels of the Aie and Brahmaputra Rivers, as well as the collapse of Mathauri along with the Nonai River. Our dedicated volunteers promptly responded to these devastating situations, rescuing people and going door-to-door to assist affected families. After relocating them to safer places, we provided essential supplies, including dry food, drinking water, rations, and tarpaulin sheets, with the collaborative support of the government.

1.A.4 Response in Gujarat Flood



In July, Gujarat experienced a devastating natural calamity due to exceptionally heavy rainfall, primarily affecting the Saurashtra district, particularly Gir Somnath, causing severe flooding and displacing numerous families. Furthermore, a two-story building collapsed in the Kadiwad locality. Our team, in collaboration with the NDRF, initiated a rescue operation at the site, saving hundreds of people and offering them secure shelter. Additionally, we provided cooked meals to support 3500 flood-affected individuals. To further assist those in distress, Mobility Health Camps were organized in Veraval, Patan, Nandarkhi, and Jiriyavad, all within the Gir Somnath district, providing essential medical check-ups and medicines to over 500 individuals, ensuring they received proper care during these challenging times.

Response in UP East Flood



Team SBF and volunteers at UP East Flood Site

In August, devastating floods occurred in the Bangarmau District of Unnao, UP East, particularly impacting the Katari area along the Ganga River. These floods submerged numerous villages located approximately 15km from the riverbank, with floodwaters extending up to 7km from the river. Our volunteers conducted visits to over a dozen affected villages, including, Biryagada, Khairuddinpur, Setuwahi, Mallahanpurwa, Faridpur Kattar, Mela Alam, Bikharipur Patasiya, Gahar Purwa, and Budda. The floods had resulted in complete crop destruction, rendering agricultural fields unproductive and severely affecting the livelihoods of countless farmers.

Response in Telangana Flood



Devastating floods have struck Telangana's Mulugu district due to heavy rainfall. In these trying times, our 10 volunteers of SBF team from MP visited the flood affected area of Mulugu where they distributed essential items and conducted thorough surveys to better understand the needs of the affected residents. Moreover, our team had a significant meeting with IPS Ghaus Alam. The discussions held during this meeting were aimed at strategizing effective measures for relief.

1.B.1 Fire Incident in Shriram Village (West Bengal)



On 8th April 2023, a fire incident occurred in Shriram Village, Raninagar-1 Block, Murshidabad District, resulting in the complete destruction of approximately **43** houses. The fire ravaged essential belongings including documents, clothing, food, motorbikes, Cylinders, goats, and other items. Reacting promptly, our team visited the affected areas to assess the damage and understand the immediate needs of the community. As a first step towards providing relief, we distributed ration kits to the affected families.



1.B.2 Fire Incident in Dhubri (Assam North)



On December 27, 2023, Khodarsar in Shilghakari area (Dhubri district), Kambhasani, had **06** families affected by the massive fire. After the incident occurred, the state convener of SBF and SBF's local volunteers reached the area and met affected families. The state convener of SBF collected donations from the public and provided one fire relief kit and an essential item kit to each affected family.



1.B.3 Fire Incident in Harda (M.P)

“ After the fire incident in the firecracker factory in Harda, Madhya Pradesh, volunteers of Society for Bright Future reached the spot, took information about the matter and provided immediate assistance as could be done.



1.B.4 Fire Incident in Uluberia (West Bengal)

“ In April, a devastating fire in Nimdighi Village, Uluberia, destroyed 30 houses, leaving approximately 120-130 people homeless. Our dedicated volunteers immediately rushed to the affected area to assist with the rescue operation. And then we came into action by organizing a ration kit distribution program in Uluberia. We provided ration kits, including dry food and baby foods, to affected families.

1.C.1 Response in Train accident Balasore (Odisha)



“ In Balasore District, Odisha, a devastating incident occurred when three trains collided on 2nd June 2023. As a result, 261+ lives lost, with over 900 people grievously injured. In response to this tragedy, SBF quickly send a core of volunteers from West Bengal to the site of train accident. Working alongside the NDRF and other government agencies, our volunteers valiantly participated in the rescue operations. Following the rescue efforts, our volunteers visited the injured individuals and distributed food packets in hospitals. Additionally, our incredible volunteers selflessly donated blood. ”



1.C.2 Response in Buxar Train accident (Bihar)

“ Four people died and 60 were injured after six compartments of the Kamakhya junction-bound 12506 Northeast Express derailed near Bihar’s Buxar district. In this time of diversity, our dedicated volunteers from Patna and Rafeeganj have reached the site, provided unwavering support, and been involved in the rescue and relief efforts for the victims. ”

1.D.1 Response in Landslide Karim Ganj (Assam South)

On the night of 22nd June 2023, a team of volunteers from SBF Assam South Zone visited Rabbania Part 11 Village, Karim Ganj district, Assam. There were four families who had been affected by land subsidence. Our volunteers went to the houses of the effected families. They provided relief and ensured their safety. After helping the affected families, they prepared a detailed report about the incident and submitted this report to the District Disaster Management Authority (DDMA).

1.D.2 Response in Building Collapse (Gujarat)

A tragic incident occurred in Gujarat's Junagadh city on 24th July 2023. Amid the incessant rainfall a two-story building collapsed in Kadiawad locality. The building comprised shops and residential units, and there are grave concerns as 20 people are feared trapped under the debris.

Our SBF team along with the NDRF, have played an important role in a rescue operation the site. We had closely monitored the situation for the safety and well-being of all those affected.

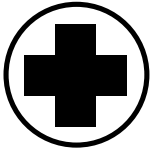

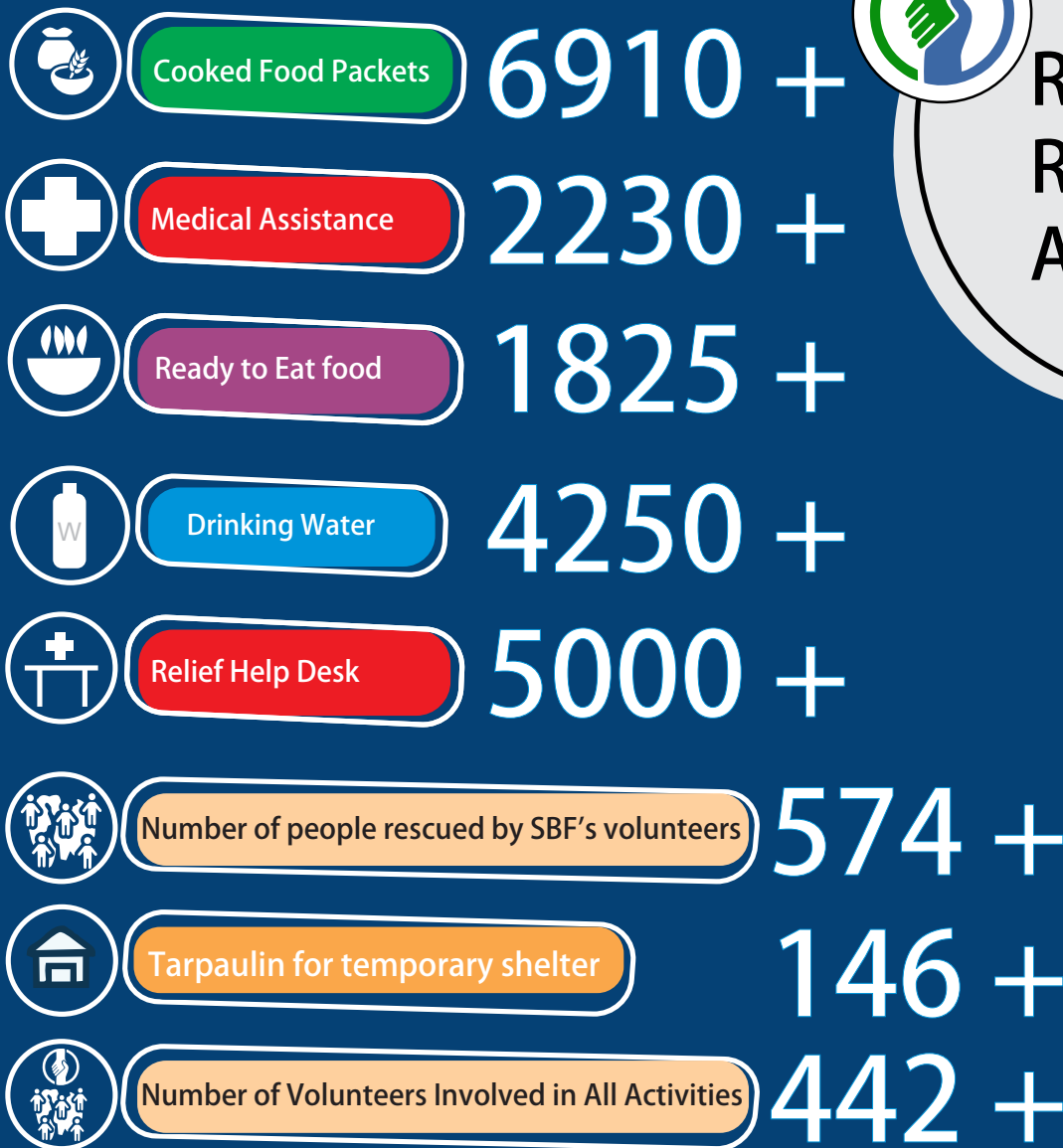
1.E.1 Cyclone Biparjoy (Gujarat)



In the month of June, Gujarat was on high alert as Cyclone Biparjoy posed a significant threat. In anticipation of the cyclone, our team moved there to provide relief assistance. Our team relocated 300 individuals to safer places, provided food support to 1000 people, and successfully distributed tarpaulin sheets to 80 deserving families in Kachchh district, Gujarat.

2.A A-To prevent from Cyclone Biparjoy (Gujarat)



In light of the Cyclone Biparjoy, a high-level meeting was organized by SBF Headquarter and presided by SBF President Mr. Makbul Ahmed Anarwala (Retd. IPS) on 13th June. The team of our volunteers visited different areas in Amreli. They met with the Disaster management agencies to gather information about the potential impact of the Biparjoy cyclone on Gujarat state, specifically in Amreli district. They also met with the fire station department to work together and respond to the situation. Our team also assessed the situation in Rajula, Jaffrabad, and Panthak.

2.B To prevent from flood in Karim Ganj (Assam South)

“ We conducted a Flood Preparedness Cum Area Core Meeting on 20th June. Led by Mr. Selim Ahmed, the program brought together seven area core representatives and Mr. Nurul Islam from the State Disaster Response Force (SDRF). The key discussion points covered risk assessment, emergency response plans, early warning systems, infrastructure and drainage evaluation, community engagement, resource allocation, and collaboration and coordination. Its primary objective was to strengthen flood preparedness and foster a unified approach to flood management.

Trained trainers from different fields have trained the volunteers. The **06** day National Advanced Training Workshop (Disaster Management and Modern Rescue Techniques) was organized at Wild Hawk, Dhauj (Haryana). In this **06** day training program, **50** participants from **15** states of India participated to get training, and in this training program, everyone got information about First Aid, Rock Climbing, River Crossing, Survival Skills in the Jungle, Improved Raft Making, Team Building, Mass Crematorium, Personality Development, and how to save people during disasters like floods.

The participants were trained by trained trainers who had trained people associated with various government and non-government organizations in India. This training was conducted under the supervision of Mr. Maqbool Ahmed Anarwala, President of the Society for Bright Future.

The Society for a Bright Future (SBF) organized **05** domestic risk mitigation workshops for women in **02** states of India, with the participation of more than **300** individuals eager to learn from expert facilitators. Some of the participants were housewives, and some of them were school teachers. National-level trainers have trained women. The trainers have given training to the women on first aid, firefighting, methods of rescue during fire at home and school, rescue in an earthquake, and paramedical psycho physiotherapy.

“ SBF diligently organized **39** plantation programs in **07** distinct states, encompassing location from Assam north and south, West Bengal, Punjab, UP West, Bihar, Madhya Pradesh and Uttarakhand. We planted more than **2650** saplings during these events, symbolizing the community’s commitment to promote a greener and healthier environment for future generations. ”

“ We established blood donation groups in **18** core areas spanning Assam, Bengal, UP West, and MP. These groups were formed with the primary objective of offering immediate blood support to patients in need. Each member of these groups has pledged to donate blood whenever hospitals require it. In **03** of the area cores in West Bengal and MP, we organized blood donation camps, and during these events, every member of the group donated blood, resulting in the collection of **66** units of blood. ”

“ SBF has organized **30** Jal Rahat Shivar programs across different districts of **04** states of India. In which MP, UP West, Delhi and Jharkhand are included. This proactive initiative aimed to provide relief to commuters, pedestrians, and individuals who were facing discomfort due to the intense summer heat.



4.D General Health Camp



“ SBF organized three general health camps at Jabalpur unit, Madhya Pradesh, Dhubri, Assam North and Howrah, West Bengal. Camps proved beneficial to more than **800** attendees, encompassing over **60** patients in need of cataract surgery.





In September 2023, we distributed **5000+** N95 masks and **200+** Infrared thermometers among patients at AIIMS Hospital Delhi, providing extensive coverage, especially in the Emergency and Children's Department, ensuring the health and safety of the community.

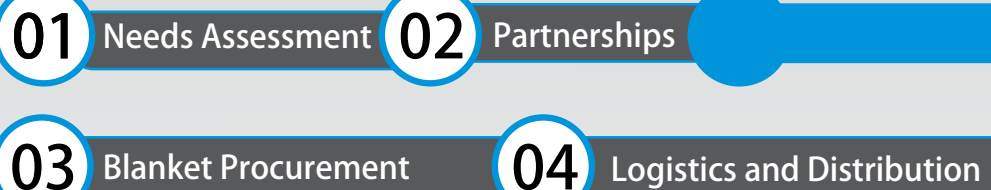
Introduction

As winter approached from November to January, the need to address the challenges faced by marginalized communities became apparent. With the support of generous donors and dedicated volunteers, the Winter Relief Blanket Distribution Project Rahat aimed to make a tangible difference in the lives of those struggling to withstand the cold.

Scope of the Initiative

The initiative covered **16** zones of **14** states of India and distributed **17392** Blankets to needy. targeting areas with the highest levels of need. The goal was to distribute high-quality blankets to families and individuals facing economic hardship, homelessness, or inadequate shelter.

Implementation Process



- 01 **Needs Assessment:** Prior to distribution, a comprehensive needs assessment was conducted in collaboration with Volunteer, partner NGOs, and community leaders to identify the most vulnerable populations.
- 02 **Partnerships:** Strategic partnerships were formed with local businesses, non-profit organizations, and other donors to ensure a coordinated and efficient distribution process.
- 03 **Blanket Procurement:** Blankets were sourced from reliable suppliers, ensuring they met quality standards and were suitable for providing adequate warmth in winter conditions.

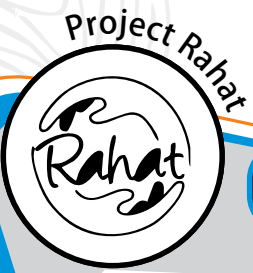

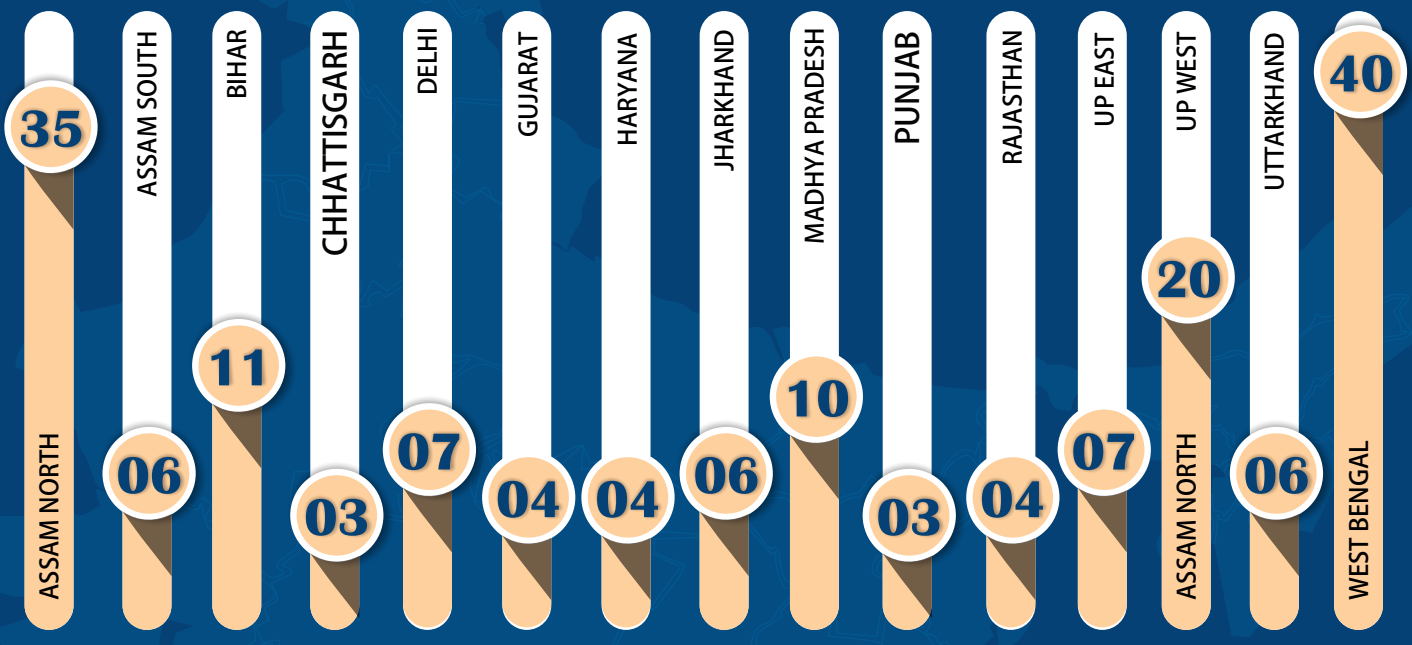

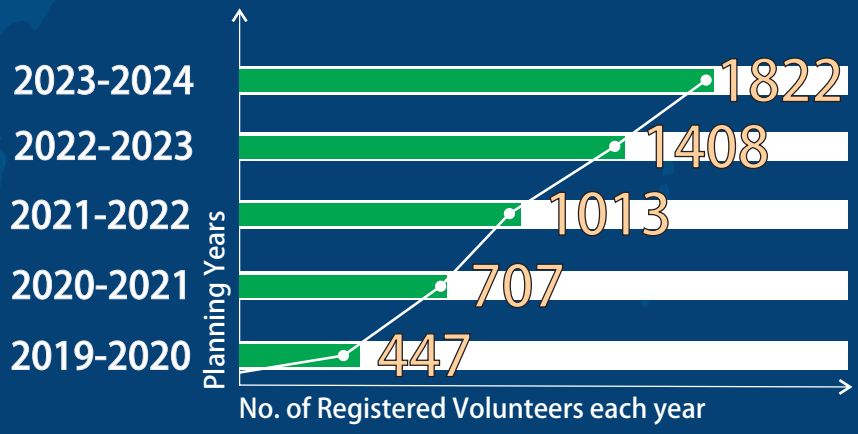
