

WBCS Residential Coaching Centre in Kolkata Outcome so far Prelims 19 Qualified 12 Secured Govt Jobs WBCS is the state administrative civil service cadre of the Indian state of West Bengal. The competitive exam for the same is conducted every year by the Public Service Commission of West Bengal- PSCWB.

WBCS Coaching Program is a promising project initiated by Vision 2026 under CTAG. The program aims at providing residential and free coaching for West Bengal Civil Service. Under the program, we started a residential coaching centre in Kolkata, West Bengal. So far 58 students in 3 batches have received coaching. Total 19 students have qualified prelims exams and 12 of them secured government jobs. In the current Batch 9 students have qualified prelim exam their mains result is to be declared. This is the first of its kind as the organization is planning to set up such centres in other underperforming districts as well.

Al Shifa Multispeciality Hospital facilitates around 20 departments including diagnostic centres with a total number of 360+ qualified staff. In collaboration with the Govt. of Delhi, Al Shifa is also running a free vaccination centre. In 2024, around 1,60,380 people were the beneficiaries of the hospital services. Rs. 39,,98,515/- was spent by Al Shifa for free/charitable services. Free medicines worth Rs. 30,50,700/- on MRP were dispensed to the beneficiaries through the mobile medical van program.





Under the program, we provide food kits to the neediest twice a year. In 2024, we could reach 1,02,000 families in 22 states of the country.
